

Disabled Account Notification from Vimeo

Dear :

You recently received notification that one or more of your video(s) were removed from Vimeo based on a Digital Millennium Copyright Act (“DMCA”) takedown notice.

This takedown constitutes the third unresolved copyright “strike” against your account. In accordance with our [copyright policy](#), your Vimeo account has been disabled for repeat copyright infringement.

If you believe the takedown was the result of a mistake by the claimant and you wish to formally challenge it, you may do so by following the process described here: https://vimeo.com/dmca#counter_notification. The form to submit a counter-notification regarding your disabled account can be found here: https://vimeo.com/dmca/counter_disabled.

Alternately, you may contact the copyright holder (or their representative) directly and ask them to withdraw their claim. Their contact information should be in the notice you received.

Your Vimeo account cannot be fully restored unless one or more of the strikes are resolved.

If you do not wish to contest the strikes but are seeking access to your other videos, we are able to place your account into Temporary Access Mode. This will restore your account in a limited capacity for 72 hours so that you are able archive your videos.
